Dear Doctor:

In compliance with the rules of the Board of Health in relation to the bodies removed from the Old Masonic Cemetery under Ordinance No. 8108, New Series, we are handing you herewith an alphabetical list of the interments in the Old Masonic Cemetery, giving the lot number and section from which the remains were disinterred and stating to which cemetery the bodies were removed.

The register is in two sections, known as Section 1 and Section 2, copied from the register of the Old Masonic Cemetery, and the names can be alphabetically located in either one of the two sections. You will notice most of the bodies were removed to our Woodlawn Memorial Park, where they were reinterred in one of the most beautiful sections, on which section the Directors have erected, at great expense, a magnificent monument in honor of the pioneers removed from the Old Masonic Cemetery.

All the graves are under perpetual care and each grave will have a separate concrete marker giving the tier and number of the interment. These markers will be placed as soon as the ground is settled.

We respectfully suggest an inspection of that section in Woodlawn, as well as an inspection of the records showing the method of locating all these reinterred bodies. Our Superintendent, Mr. A. W. Leavitt, will be at your disposal upon telephone notice to this office.

The Cemetery Association affecting such general removals shall by such means as may be deemed appropriate exclude from the Cemetery, from which human remains are being disinterred and removed, all persons except those actually engaged in such disinterment and removal and any persons who are entitled by law to be present.

Subject to the foregoing Rules and Regulations and such amendments thereto as may hereafter be made, the Board of Health of the City and County of San Francisco hereby issues to the Masonic Cemetery Association and the Odd Fellows Cemetery Association, which cemeteries have been ordered removed by ordinance of the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco as specified above, a general permit to disinter, remove and transport all human remains now interred in their Cemetery properties in the City and County of San Francisco to Cemetery or Cemeteries, Mausoleums or Columbariums outside the said City and County.

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

