

SAN FRANCISCO (City and County Consolidated 1856.) P O, and Incorporated City. Boundaries—North and East by the Bay of San Francisco, south by San Mateo, and west by the Pacific Ocean. Area of the City and County, about 42 square miles. This city, the commercial metropolis of California, is most favorably situated on the west shore of the Bay from which it derives its name. Possessing the only large and secure harbor on the Pacific Coast for a distance of nearly 2,000 miles, and the means of easy and rapid communications with a rich and prosperous inland population, this city already enjoys a large and important share of the trade of this Coast. The San José Railroad, connecting this city with San José, is 50 miles in length, and the Western Pacific Railroad, now in the course of construction, will connect this road, via Stockton, with the Central Pacific Railroad at Sacramento, thus forming a continuous line of railway from San Francisco to the eastern boundary of the State, and constituting the western division of the great Pacific Railroad. In addition to eight different lines of street railroads, the following are in operation in the vicinity of San Francisco, which, with the aid of steamers, furnish convenient means of communication with rich and flourishing interior localities, viz: San Francisco and Oakland, San Francisco and Alameda, Napa, and the Petaluma. This city is also connected with the leading ports of the North Pacific by lines of first class ocean steamships. Regular trips are made to Panama, San Juan del Sur, the Pacific Mexican ports, Vancouver, and the different seaports of this State, Oregon, and Washington Territory. The new line to China will commence its monthly trips on the first day of January next; and a line to Honolulu, Sandwich Islands, has been provided for by a recent Act of Congress. Legal distances: From Sacramento, 117 miles; from Stockton, 117 miles; and from San Quentin, 12 miles.
