Austin, Lander Co, P O, county seat of Lander Co and incorporated city, situated on the Overland Mail Route, 187 miles e of Virginia City, and 415 miles w of Great Salt Lake City. This city, the center of the great Reese River mining region, was settled about the years 1862-3. It is situated in Taleot or Pony Cañon, on the Toiyabe range of mountains, and occupies an area of two square miles. It is the seat of considerable trade, and contains a population of about 3,000. A number of fine brick buildings have already been erected, and several associations of a religious and benevolent character are in operation. The Reese River Daily Reveille is published here.
