**WASATCH COUNTY.** Boundaries—North by Summit and Green River, east by Colorado Territory, south by San Pete, and west by Utah, Great Salt Lake County, and Summit. It is in the northeast section of the Territory, and has an estimated area of 9,500 square miles. The small portion that is under cultivation yields an average crop. In 1865, 1,591 acres were under cultivation, of which 988 were in wheat. County seat, Heber City. (No returns of county officers received.)

**WASHINGTON COUNTY.** Boundaries—North by Iron, east by Kane, south by Territory of Arizona, and west by the State of Nevada. This county is in the southwestern extremity of the Territory, bordering on Arizona. The eastern part is mountainous, but there is much fine productive land in the county. Cotton is raised with great success in the vicinity of Virgin and Santa Clara rivers, and tobacco and tropical fruits thrive and yield abundant crops. The average yield of grain per acre is not as large as in the more northern counties. In 1865, there were 2,781 acres under cultivation, of which 790 were in wheat, and 500 in fruit. Number of mills: saw, six; grist, two. County seat, St. George.
