

Five Classes have graduated from the Collegiate Department. Seventeen teachers are connected with the Institution, and there are about 120 scholars receiving instruction in the various Departments.

OAKLAND ACADEMY.—This is a Military, Classical and English School for boys and young men. It was opened in this city January 9th, 1865, and was removed to its present locality on the Telegraph road, January 10th, 1868. There are employed seven teachers, and there are 60 boarders, the limited number. The School is the private property of the Rev. David McClure, who is the Principal. Family and military discipline are combined, and the School is unlike any other in the State. The entire School forms one military company, known as the "Oakland Academy Cadets," which is organized under the State Law, and is furnished with arms.

ROMAN CATHOLIC CONVENT.—In the summer of 1868, the "Convent of our Lady of the Sacred Heart" was dedicated to its purposes of education. The teachers are "Sisters of the Holy names of Jesus and Mary," who came from Canada to accept their present positions. The course of study is extensive, and all the branches usually taught in female seminaries or academies are there to be learned. The Rev. Father King is the founder of the Institution, the means for building it having been raised by his personal exertions.
