BROOKLYN MANUFACTURING COMPANY.—This establishment is located on Washington street, between Larue street and Broadway, in Brooklyn. Fifteen men find constant employment. The works are under the supervision of V. S. Northey and James McGrath. All kinds of agricultural implements, whether of wood or iron, are manufactured here. Every year about 30 carriages and great quantities of plows are made and the repair shop is also very extensive. This enterprise was inaugurated in 1851, but the present Company was incorporated in 1866.

SAN ANTONIO TANNERY.—This tannery was established by Wilcox & Rohrs in 1865, and is still owned by that firm. There are at the tannery fifty-five vats, capable of turning out 600 sides of leather each month. The establishment is worth about \$20,000 and is doing a very prosperous business. Near the tannery is the extensive Brooklyn Pottery, which supplies the pottery for all the nurseries in the bay counties, and does a very extensive business in the manufacture of the coarser articles.

BROOKLYN BRICK KILNS.—The brick yards of the Reimillard Brothers, are located near the town of San Antonio, and during the year upwards of five millions of building brick have been manufactured from the deposits of sand and clay near at hand.

CLINTON FLOURING MILLS.—The Clinton Flouring Mills were the first established in the northern portion of Alameda county and are now owned by Bassett & Co. The mills can turn out 100 barrels of flour in 12 hours and at the same time grind the grists usually left there by farmers desiring flour manufactured from wheat grown on their own lands. The machinery is run by a forty-horse power steam engine, and the flour ground finds a ready market in San Francisco and in all parts of the country.

NURSERY.—John Carey has the large nursery near the High School building, which is very extensive and can furnish all kinds of trees and shrubs to be found at such establishments.

FUSE FACTORY.—A small fuse factory has been in operation about two years, a mile and a half from San Antonio.

Churches and Sabbath Schools.

PRESBYTERIAN.—The First Presbyterian Church is located on the corner of Arroya and Adams streets, and has 40 members. It is a wooden structure and was built in 1861. The present pastor is Rev. A. M. Stewart. The Trustees are W. A. Bray, W. H. Hamilton, A. W. Swett, Wm. Maxwell and E. M. Derby. W. H. Hamilton is Elder and also Superintendent of the Sabbath School connected with the Church. The school has 70 scholars and teachers, and a library containing 600 volumes. This Church is entirely out of debt and has increased its membership by the addition of six persons during the year.

EPISCOPAL.—The Episcopal Church is located on the corner of Broadway and Adams street and has fifty communicants. It is a wooden building, erected in 1860. Rev. Daniel Kendig is Rector. The vestrymen are E. G. Matthews, James Larue, Chas. Nichols, Dr. Treanor, Capt. Rodgers, Thos. S. Smith and J. B. Larue. The Sabbath School has 65 scholars and a small but well selected library.

BAPTIST.—A Free Will Baptist Church was organized during the year, but it has ceased to exist. The regular Baptist Church is located on the corner of Adams and Taylor streets, and at the date of our review had no settled pastor. The Rev. John Francis had for many years been the minister. The Church was built in 1860. There are 35 members, and the Trustees are: Dr. Bamford, Stephen Hilton, A. Warner, E. Grover and B. Bangle. The Sunday School has 70 scholars and teachers, and the library contains 300 volumes.

CATHOLIC.—The Brooklyn Roman Catholic Church has a membership of 300 hundred persons, and is presided over by Rev. Father Byrne, of Oakland. The Treasurer is John Carey. The Sabbath School has 50 pupils.

TOWN OF LYNN.—The town of Lynn was laid out by Messrs. Farrier & Manning, about two years ago, and they organized a boot and shoe manufacturing company, which
