**MARTINEZ**—Opposite Benicia, is the county seat of Contra Costa county. It is a pretty village, pleasantly situated, and has between five and six hundred inhabitants. In addition to the County Court House and Jail, it contains three churches, one Masonic hall, three hotels, one livery stable, several general merchandise stores, one grist mill, etc. A weekly newspaper is published here, and a flourishing division of the Sons of Temperance is now sustained. Martinez is connected with Benicia by a steam ferry. A large quantity of fruit is grown in the vicinity. Two miles from town is the famous Alhambra ranch, containing about 28,000 grape vines and 5,000 fruit trees.
