Shasta, Shasta Co, P O and County seat, is

situated in the midst of a rich placer and quartz mining section. This place was formerly an important center of trade for all the northern portion of the State, but the construction of the California and Oregon Railroad, which has its terminus at Redding, a few miles distant, has turned the tide of travel, but it still enjoys considerable trade. The place was settled as "Redding's Springs," in 1850, but the name was subsequently changed in honor of the grand mountain peak that overlooks the region. Shasta is in the foot-hills of the mountains, enclosing the Sacramento Valley, at an elevation of 1,160 feet, two miles west of the river, and one hundred and seventy miles north of the city of Sacramento. The climate is pleasant and healthy, and the town continues to be the favorite place of residence of the pioneers of the section. The *Shasta Courier* was established in 1852, and is published weekly, being one of the oldest papers of the State.
