The lofty San Gabriel Mountains rise precipitously to northward, and a broad stretch of undulating country surround it, generally devoted to grazing and to waste chapparell, but susceptible of tillage.

St. Helena, Napa Co, 18 miles n w of Napa City, is a lovely little village, on the western side of Napa Valley, on the line of the railroad from Vallejo to Callistoga. The large vineyard, wine cellar and distillery of Mr. Charles Krug, are in the vicinity, and constitute an important feature in the business of the place, he making about 100,000 gallons of wine annually. His fine gardens, with orange and other semi-tropical trees and fruits, are proof of the wealth of the soil and equality of the climate. A great deal of wine is made by other parties. In the neighboring hills, veins of gold and silver bearing

quartz have been discovered, giving a prospect of converting St. Helena from the quiet summer resort to the busy mining town. Some quicksilver mines near by have been successfully worked. A public school, with 280 pupils, is maintained with great care. One newspaper, the *Star*, is published weekly.
