 guished for its early fruits and vegetables, and for the
 large quantities sent to the city markets, the amount
 reaching to 50 and 60 tons per day in the season. A
 fruit-drying establishment of the Alden patent aids
 the business of the fruit-grower. Raisins of a su-
 perior quality are cured in large quantities.
