Idaho City, Boise Co, incorporated February 1st, 1864, P O and County seat, distant 36 miles n e of Boise City. It is built at the confluence of Elk and Moore Creeks. Next to Boise City, the capital, it is the largest city in Idaho Territory.

The rich and extensive placer mines existing in its immediate neighborhood, are its main support. Several gold and silver bearing quartz ledges have been discovered in its vicinity. About two miles to the southwest of the city are a number of warm springs, which are a favorite place of resort to the inhabitants of the district during the summer and fall months. Daily lines of stages run to Winnemucca, Central Pacific Railroad via Boise City, and also to Umatilla, on the Columbia River, Oregon, there connecting with the Oregon Steam Navigation Company's steamers for Portland. One newspaper, the *Idaho World*, is published semi-weekly.
