The sermon was preached by Father Gallagher, to whom, nearly twenty years before, the Catholics of Oakland were in a great measure indebted for their first place of worship. The entire cost of the building is about \$33,000. It will seat about twelve hundred and fifty persons.

Masses on Sundays, at seven, eight, nine, and half-past ten o'clock A.M. Vespers at half-past seven o'clock P.M. Mass on week days at seven o'clock A.M.

The Sunday school connected with the Church was organized in 1853. It has an attendance of six hundred and fifty scholars. The school for girls meets at half-past nine o'clock A.M. Superintendent, Rev. Michael King.

ST. ANTHONY'S—ROMAN CATHOLIC.

Location, northwest corner of East Fifteenth Street and Sixteenth Avenue. Rev. William Gleeson, Pastor; Rev. J. B. McNally, Assistant Pastor; residence, adjoining the church.

The lot on which this church stands was purchased by the parish in 1868, for the sum of \$700; and the edifice erected the same year, at a cost of \$1,600. The congregation numbers about four hundred and fifty. Mass on Sundays at forty-five minutes past ten o'clock A.M.; and on week days at seven o'clock A.M. Vespers on Sundays at half-past seven o'clock P.M.

The Sunday school connected with the church has an attendance of about one hundred and twenty-five scholars. Superintendent, Rev. William Gleeson.

CHURCH OF THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS (R. C.).

Location, Evoy Avenue, between Grove and West streets. Rev. L. Serda, Pastor; residence, south side of Fortieth Street, near Grove, Temescal.

The church was dedicated in December, 1876, and cost, up to that time, \$8,000, and will cost, when completed, \$15,000. The lot upon which the church stands was donated by Mrs. McCourtney and Zachariah Montgomery. The congregation numbers about seven hundred and fifty. Masses on Sundays at eight and half past ten o'clock A.M., and on week days at eight o'clock A.M. Sunday school is held at twenty minutes past one o'clock P.M.

SEVENTH DAY ADVENTISTS.

Location, northeast corner of Clay and Thirteenth streets. Elder J. N. Loughborough, Pastor; residence, 776 Eighteenth Street.

This church had its origin in the Summer of 1874, when a small congregation was brought together, through a series of tent meetings from April to July of that year. Regular meetings were held from that time in a hall corner of Broadway and Twelfth streets, until the erection of their church building, which was dedicated April 1, 1877.

Regular services, Sabbath (Saturday), at half past ten o'clock A.M.; also, Sunday and Tuesday evenings. Sabbath school meets at nine o'clock A.M. Average attendance, teachers and scholars, about one hundred.

CHRIST'S CHURCH OF LATTER-DAY SAINTS.

Organized in 1877. This church has no regular pastor, but is served by various members and visiting elders. Meets every Sunday in Kohler's Hall, northwest corner Seventh Street near Chester, at eleven o'clock A.M. and half past seven o'clock P.M. Membership, about thirty.
