

was therefore \$43,476.35, a little over ten per cent. The expenditures of the year in the various departments of the Municipal Government show a corresponding increase. The bonded indebtedness of the city have been diminished \$18,400. In proportion to population and wealth the funded debt of Oakland is far below the average debt of cities throughout the United States.

The item of \$173,000 bonds issued in 1875 was for the construction of the Lake Sewer, and is payable by the property benefitted by that improvement, the city only extending its guarantee.

Exclusive of the Main Lake Sewer bonds, payable by the property adjacent, the sum total of the indebtedness of Oakland is but \$481,000. No new issue of bonds has been made since 1874.
