U. S. Census, 1870, 10,500; 1880, 34,555; estimated June 1, 1887, 47,870. Population of Oakland and vicinity embraced in the Directory, 55,000, not including Alameda and Berkeley.

The estimate of the population of our city for June 1, 1887, is based on the returns of the School Census Marshal, showing June 1, total number of children, 11,237. Assuming the ratio 4.26 to be correct, the population is as given above, viz., 47,870.
