There are two post-offices within the limits of the city, and the free delivery system is also under consideration by the post-office authorities.

There are two papers published in Alameda: The *Encinal*, weekly, which has been published for twenty-one years, and the *Argus*, semi-weekly, now in its twelfth year.

Numerous churches and fraternal organizations have been established, and are in a flourishing condition.
