

MARIN COUNTY.

With the exception of San Francisco and San Mateo counties, Marin County is one of the smallest in area, though by no means least in importance. Like the proverbial "precious things done up in small parcels," Marin County is small, but unexceptionally delightful. There are beautiful homes, lovely farms, quiet towns and suburban resorts, where those grown weary and *blasé* can find rest, enjoyment and repose, surrounded by Nature's charms; for the scenery in some parts is most picturesque and grand. Over all Old Tamalpais, with his great bald head, seems to stand as sentinel to guard from harm the beautiful country Nature has laid at his feet. The climate is very healthful, and consequently is made the residence of invalids from all parts of the State and particularly many who are obliged to do business in San Francisco, but who are unable to endure its injurious winds and fogs. There are large dairying farms here, which are a source of wealth to the County. Marin is bounded on the north by Sonoma County, on the east by Sonoma County, San Pablo and San Francisco Bays, on the south by the Golden Gate and on the west by the Pacific Ocean. Its county seat is San Rafael.
