This town, situated about 20 miles south of Eureka, at the lower end of the fine agricultural valley formed by the Eel River, is the business center for the finest farming section of the county, the prolific and inexhaustible bottom lands in the neighborhood being noted for the excellence, abundance, and never-failing character of their crops. A direct line of communication with San Francisco, via Port Kenyon, by steamer, is maintained, as well as daily communication with Eureka, thus adding materially to the welfare of the community. The town is well built, and sustains its full complement of business establishments, all of which are doing a thriving trade. A good system of water works provides for the town's wants. The town sustains a newspaper, the *Ferndale Enterprise*, a bright and sparkling weekly, fully alive to the interests of the valley. It has post office, express, and telegraphic accommodations, and a population of about 1,200.
