THIS, the largest city of the county, is situated in the extreme southwestern part and is the southern terminus of the Napa Valley branch of the California Pacific Railroad. It has many natural advantages all of which conspire to advance its material interests. Deep water ships load directly at this point, large numbers of cargoes being annually taken. Aside from the ordinary business characteristics found in cities of its size, the location at Mare Island of the United States Navy Yard is to Vallejo a feature of great importance, as it is fair to say that much over half of Vallejo's material prosperity depends on it. The Navy Yard employs from 500 to 1200 men. Here also is found the Orphans' Home erected and maintained under the auspices of the Good Templars, which in its workings has proven a noble and comprehensive charity.
