Ukiah.

A post, express and telegraph office, the county seat, and one of the oldest towns in the State. Geographically, it is in the center of the county, thus making it the most desirable for the honor it bears. It is a prosperous town of about 1,500 inhabitants, well built and pleasantly located in the heart of a rich agricultural and pastoral region, the productions of which contribute largely towards swelling the exports of the State. It is also the distributing point of mail matter for a large section of the county. Altitude about 800 feet. The Court House and Jail, built in 1872, cost \$40,000. It has six churches and excellent schools. The central point of J. L. Sanderson & Co.'s Stage Lines to Eureka, Cloverdale, Mendocino City, Lakeport, Upper Lake, Bartlett Springs, etc. There are a number of springs, both hot and cold, possessing medicinal properties that are highly prized by invalids. The hotel accommodations are excellent, the Palace Hotel kept by Mr. W. A. Hagans being worthy of special mention. The Ukiah House, the other leading hotel of the county seat, is kept by Mr. W. A. Hagans, an old and experienced caterer.
