**ALVARADO.**—This town is about twenty-six miles southeast of San Francisco, and about four miles from the line of the Central Pacific Railroad, Decoto being the nearest station. Excepting Oakland, this is one of the liveliest towns in the county. There are several manufactories here. The principal ones are the salt factory and the California Beet Sugar Company's factory. This company was established on the 9th of May, 1870, and is the pioneer and only successful one in the United States. Seventy-five men are employed, and sixty tons of beets are worked every twenty-four hours.
