REV. ADOLPH RAHN, Pastor. Services every Sunday at 10 o'clock A. M., in the Chinese Mission Chapel, cor of Stockton and Sacramento streets.

METHODIST EPISCOPAL.**Powell Street Church.**

REV. JESSE T. PECK, D. D., Pastor. Residence, next door to the Church; Location W s Powell between Washington and Jackson; organized in the autumn of 1849, by Rev. William Taylor. During that season a small building received from Oregon was erected on the half of a fifty vara lot, which had been obtained from Mr. John Trubody. In the year 1851 this building was enlarged; in 1852, it was removed to give place to the present structure, which was opened for public worship in February, 1853. Number of communicants, 200. Preaching on Sunday at 11 A. M. and 7½ P. M. Sunday School 2½ P. M. Sabbath School Superintendent, John Burns, Jr. Number of teachers, 24; scholars, 143.

Methodist Episcopal Church, South.

REV. O. P. FITZGERALD, Pastor. Location, north side of Pine Street, between Montgomery and Kearny. Reorganized December, 1858.

Public services Sabbath morning and evening, at 11 A. M. and 7½ o'clock, P. M. Prayer Meeting on Wednesday evening at 7½ o'clock. Sunday School at 2½ o'clock on Sabbath.

Officers—Class Leader, C. L. Newman; Stewards, D. O. Shattuck, Joseph Genella, W. B. Parsons and A. G. Kitching.

Folsom Street Methodist Episcopal Church, between First and Second.

REV. J. ASBURY BRUNER, Pastor. Residence, rear of church. Sunday morning and evening service at the usual hours; seats free. Sunday School at 2 o'clock P. M. Prayer Meeting, etc., on Wednesday evening.

This society, organized in 1852, under the superintendence of Rev. Isaac Owen, erected, and dedicated, December 5th, 1853, a plain, but substantial, neatly furnished house of worship; which, last summer, was thoroughly refitted. The number of communicants was, in September, 1858, 70, since which 30 have been added, making in all, 100, up to February of present year, at which date a deep religious interest pervades the society. Sabbath School Superintendent, W. H. Coddington; number of teachers, 20; scholars, 150; volumes in the Library, 870.

Bethel Methodist Episcopal Church.

JOHN DANIEL, Pastor. Residence, 178 Mission Street; Location, Mission between First and Second streets.

This Church was organized early in 1851, under the pastoral charge of Rev. W. Taylor.

Service was then held in the ship *Panama*, on Davis Street. Subsequently the ship was moved to the foot of Mission Street and a church built on deck. Early in 1857 the church was taken down and rebuilt in its present eligible situation. Services at the usual hours on Sabbath morning and evening. Sabbath School at 2 P. M.

German Methodist Church.

REV. CHARLES AUGUSTUS E. HERTEL, Pastor. Residence, Pine Street, 2d door W of Dupont, in rear of Church; Location, NW corner of Pine and Dupont.

This congregation was organized by the lato pastor, the Rev. A. Kellner, Sept. 21st, 1856, who was commissioned to California as a Missionary from the M. E. Church, and arrived in California May 1st, 1855. The building is of brick, 36 by 58, one story, and was dedicated Sept. 21st, 1856. Public services every Sunday at 10½ A. M. and 7½ P. M. Sunday School at 9 A. M., Superintendent, Albert Miller; number of scholars, 110, volumes in Library, 320. Prayer and Lecture every Wednesday at 7½ P. M.

German Mission Church.

REV. AUGUSTUS KELLNER, Pastor. Organized February 20th, 1859. Residence in rear of the church; Location, N side Broadway, between Stockton and Powell. Services every Sunday, at 10½ A. M. and 7½ P. M. Sunday School at 9 A. M. Services also every Wednesday evening at 7½ o'clock.

German Mission Church.

REV. AUGUSTUS KELLNER, Pastor. Organized 4th April, 1858; Location, Mission Street, between Third and Fourth. Services every Sunday at 3 o'clock P. M. Sunday School at 2 P. M.

African Methodist Episcopal Church, Scott St.

The society worshipping here is the same that formerly occupied the St. Cyprian Church. Under the pastorate of Rev. T. M. D. Ward they organized anew in 1856, and purchased the Scott Street Church property. Since April 1857, J. B. SANDERSON has been the Pastor of this Church. Public services every Sabbath at the usual hours. Pastor's room in the rear of the church.

Methodist Episcopal Church, Zion, (col'd.)

A. B. SMITH, Pastor. Residence, 294 Pacific; Location, Pacific near Powell.

This congregation was organized by John J. Moore, the late pastor, August 1st, 1852. Up to August 13, 1856, worship was held in a frame building on Stockton Street, opposite the Marine Hospital, since which service has been held in the present brick edifice, one story of which is finished. It was dedicated Sept 7th, 1856. The expenditure on this building, thus far, has been \$4,000. Attached to the congregation is an interesting Sabbath School, numbering about 50 pupils, 6 teachers, and a Library of 500 volumes; R. T. Houston, Sup. Public services and Sabbath School every Sunday at the usual hours.
