

SEC. 7. Each Roadmaster is hereby authorized to purchase all necessary timber, planks, or other material for the construction or repair of bridges or culverts, and to hire, at just and reasonable rates, all necessary labor, tools or implements, for widening, straightening, grading, or otherwise improving such roads and highways. Each Roadmaster shall receive a reasonable compensation, to be paid out of the General Fund, not to exceed five dollars per day for each day's service rendered in the discharge of the duties of his office; *provided*, that no Roadmaster shall be entitled to receive more than three hundred dollars for all services he may render as such officer, in any one fiscal year.

SEC. 8. All Acts and parts of Acts inconsistent with, so far as they are in conflict with the provisions of this Act, are hereby repealed.*

SUPPLEMENTAL XX.—*Act concerning Roads, etc. Approved April 16, 1859.*

SEC. 1. The provisions of an Act entitled "An Act concerning roads and highways," approved April twenty-eighth, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, and the provisions of an Act entitled an Act to amend an Act entitled an Act concerning roads and highways, passed April twenty-eighth, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, approved April nineteenth, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, are hereby declared to be applicable to the city and county of San Francisco, and all roads and highways in that portion of said city and county that was not included in the city of San Francisco as the boundaries of the same, established by an Act entitled an Act to re-incorporate the city of San Francisco, passed April fifteenth, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, shall be laid out, opened, constructed, and repaired, as aforesaid in the said Acts; *Provided*, that all streets within the said former city of San Francisco, as the boundaries thereof were established by an Act entitled "An Act to re-incorporate the city of San Francisco," passed April fifteenth, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, shall be, and they are hereby, excepted from the operations of this Act.

ARTICLE VI.

FINANCE AND REVENUE.†

SEC. 75. All fines, penalties and forfeitures, imposed for offenses committed within the said city and county, shall be received by the Clerk or Magistrate of the respective court and paid into the treasury thereof, as a part of the Police Fund; forty per cent. of all poll-taxes collected in said city and county, or any other proportion of such poll-taxes which may be hereafter assigned to said city and county, by law, shall also be paid and received into the treasury thereof, as a part of the Police Fund. All demands payable out of said fund, may, in case there be not sufficient money in the treasury arising from the sources specified in this section, be paid out of the General Fund of said city and county.
