SURFACE.—Approximate area in acres, 27,000; land cultivated, 1,725 acres; land, arable, uncultivated, 9,000 acres; land for grazing, 6,000 acres; land occupied by the City proper, 2,100 acres; land, mostly barren sand hills, 8,175 acres. Of the cultivated portion, 1,000 acres are used for vegetable gardens, producing several crops a year.

AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTS.—Land cultivated as gardens, 1,000 acres; wheat, 25 acres, 700 bushels; barley, 250 acres, 7,500 bushels; oats, 450 acres, 9,000 bushels; tallow, 500,000 pounds.

FRUIT TREES AND VINES.—Apple trees, 3,500; peach, 3,500; pear, 2,700; plum, 1,700; cherry, 1,700; nectarine, 100; quince, 1,000; apricot, 2,500; fig, 100; prune, 1,000; almond, 20; gooseberry, 7,000; raspberry, 2,500; strawberry, 350,000; grape, 2,000; currant, 7,000.

LIVE STOCK.—American and horses Spanish, tame, 5,000; mules and asses, 200; cows, 2,500; calves, 800; oxen, 100; sheep, 2,000; goats, 300; hogs, 6,000; chickens, turkeys, ducks and geese, 5,000.
