


## HARRISON'S ECCENTRIC PUMP.

This pump is designed for throwing large quantities of water, either as a wrecking pump, a mining pump, or for irrigation. It is a suction and force pump, and has sucked the water up over 27½ feet.

It can be run fast or slow, and according to its speed is the quantity of water discharged.
