

Number of communicants, three hundred and fourteen. The Sunday School has an average attendance of about three hundred. Number of scholars enrolled, about four hundred and fifty. The library contains over three thousand volumes.

Sabbath services morning and evening; Sabbath School at 1 P.M. Prayer meeting every Wednesday evening; Young People's Meeting held on three Friday evenings of each month, conducted by the Pastor; Church Covenant Meeting the Friday evening preceding the First Sabbath in each month.

From this church the Second Baptist Church was organized December, 1862; the Tabernacle Baptist Church, December, 1865; and the San Pablo Baptist Church, February, 1867.

Second Baptist Church.

This house of worship is located on the corner of Fifth and Jessie Streets. Rev. C. B. HENDRICKSON, Pastor; residence, 712 Howard Street. The first steps for the organization of this church were taken in 1860, when Dr. Cheney's congregation established a Mission interest in the Nonantum School House on Third Street, near Bryant. The Sunday School was under the superintendence of H. H. Heath. After several changes, a lot was purchased on Fifth Street, corner of Jessie, where the present church was built and organized, December 22d, 1862. Rev. H. A. Sawtelle was the first pastor, who continued to officiate until October, 1866, when he retired from this pastoral charge and established the Union Square Baptist Church. The Rev. C. B. Hendrickson, for several years pastor at Stockton, was called by the congregation to fill the vacancy, and he entered upon his duties on the first of January, 1867. The Rev. O. W. Briggs officiating during the time the congregation was without a regular pastor. This church is now in a flourishing condition, with a membership of one hundred and twenty. It is designed to erect at an early day, a large and commodious edifice in the neighborhood of the present site. Services are held each Sabbath at 11 A.M., and 7½ P.M. Prayer meetings on Wednesday evening, and also on Sunday, a half hour before preaching.

A Sunday School, with an average attendance of one hundred and forty-four, and with a library of one thousand volumes, is connected with the church; Dr. J. C. Spencer, Superintendent, and — Wright, Librarian. The school meets Sunday, P.M., at 1 o'clock.

Third Baptist Church (Colored).

Rev. JOHN FRANCIS, Pastor; residence, Oakland; location of church, southeast corner of June and Natoma Streets. Services at 11 A.M., and 2½ and 7½ o'clock P.M.

This church was organized in 1851, and formerly held worship on Dupont Street, between Filbert and Greenwich. During the present year, this congregation purchased the building and grounds formerly occupied by the Howard Presbyterian Church, at a cost of \$10,000, of which amount \$1,500 has been paid, leaving a balance of \$8,500 remaining yet unpaid. The present pastor took charge of this church

on the 25th of March, 1867. It has about eighty members. Church Clerk, Edward Parker.

Sabbath School—Eight teachers and forty-four scholars.

Tabernacle Baptist Church.

North side Post Street, between Hyde and Larkin Streets. Rev. James P. Ludlow, Pastor; residence, 813 Hyde street near Bush.

Hours of service—11 A.M., and 7½ P.M., every Sunday, with a weekly prayer meeting every Wednesday evening.

Sunday School meets at 12½ o'clock P.M., every Sunday; average attendance one hundred and twenty-five; J. A. Eaton, Superintendent.

This house was dedicated August 20th, 1865, is forty-four by sixty-four feet, and presents a neat and tasty appearance. It has a seating capacity of about four hundred and fifty, and cost, with lot, about eight thousand dollars. Church organized November 23d, 1865, with a constituent membership of forty-five. Recognized by an Ecclesiastical Council duly called December 12th, 1865. Present membership, sixty-nine.

Union Square Baptist Church.

This church is located on the south side of Post street, half a block west of Union Square. Rev. HENRY A. SAWTELLE, Pastor; residence, 810 Taylor street.

The church practices what is known as open or free communion, being in this respect like the most of the English Baptist churches. In all other respects its articles of faith are in agreement with those of the Baptist churches of this city. The members must be immersed believers. The church was organized October 31st, 1866, with 53 members, to which additions have been made nearly every month, and the number now is about one hundred. Recently the church has purchased its present eligible lot, 55x137½ feet, at a cost of \$3,500, and a plain edifice, capable of seating four hundred people, is about being erected thereon.

Hours of service, on the Sabbath, at 11 A.M., and 7½ P.M. Sunday School convenes at 12½ o'clock. Prayer meetings are held on Wednesday and Friday evenings.
