The new Synagogue of this society, erected in 1866, is situated on Sutter street, between Stockton and Powell. It is an elegant and substantial structure, built of brick, at a cost, including the price paid for the lot, of \$185,000. The auditorium is fifty-three feet wide, ninety-seven feet long, and fifty feet high, affording a seating capacity for over 1,200 persons. The internal arrangements are chaste and appropriate, and admirably adapted to the purposes of the congregation. A school for the religious education of youth is conducted in the basement rooms of the synagogue building.
