SAN FRANCISCO TURN VEREIN.—Organized 1852. Rooms, Turn Hall, north side, O'Farrell Street, between Mason and Taylor.

The object of this society is the cultivation of gymnastic exercises in general, to encourage morality, to improve health, to cultivate music, and to entertain and cultivate free religious and political sentiments.

Stated meetings, first and third Wednesday evenings of each month. Number of members, two hundred and ten, of which about sixty are attached to the vocal department, under the leadership of Prof. Theo. Reuter. Besides this, there exists, in connection with the association, a Verein for boys, from fourteen to eighteen years, which numbers sixteen members, and is called the Turnzueglingverein. Stated meetings, last Wednesday evening of each month.

There is also a school for boys from seven to fourteen years, which numbers two hundred and twenty pupils.

Exercises for members every Tuesday and Thursday evenings, from 9 to 10½ o'clock, for members of the Turnzueglingverein every Monday and Wednesday evenings, and for the pupils, every Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday evenings, from 7 to 8½ o'clock.

Social meetings for members are held every Sunday evening, except the last of each month, when a dramatic entertainment is given. Strangers are only allowed admission on these evenings, when they can show a ticket of invitation from a member of the Verein.
