Organizations of the above order have existed for the past two hundred years. This sodality was founded in this city by the Rev. J. M. C. Buchard, S. J., having for its object the moral and intellectual improvement of its members. It is directed by a Chaplain, and governed by a Prefect and two assistants, together with a Secretary, Treasurer, and twelve Consultors.
