**BRITISH BENEVOLENT SOCIETY OF CALIFORNIA.**—Rooms No. 730 Montgomery Street.

This society was organized in 1865, for the purpose of affording relief to sick or destitute members and persons, who were subjects of Great Britain at the time of their birth, and of promoting the social and intellectual improvement of its members. Between twelve and thirteen hundred men, including many citizens of the United States, have been admitted to membership, and there are now some two hundred and fifty paying members including ten life members on the rolls. In May, 1867, the association was completely reorganized and incorporated, and a Constitution adopted, containing several admirable features, and, among others, provisions for free lectures and debates. From the time of its formation, the affairs of the society have been carefully and judiciously managed, and its charity dispensed with prudent liberality. It has uniformly cooperated with the San Francisco Benevolent Association and St. Andrews Society, and through its agency their burden has been greatly lightened, many hundreds of sick and destitute men, women and children, effectively relieved, and a large number provided for with employment. The relief given is, for the most part, temporary; and, at present, under the new system adopted by the Board of Relief, averages \$1,783 per case. During the year ending on April 30th, 1870, the smallest number of applications for any one month was fifty nine, and the smallest amount expended \$152.40; the largest number of applications during the same period was one hundred and sixty eight for the inclement month of January, involving expenditure of \$225.65. For the year terminating April 30th, 1870, the total number of persons assisted was nine hundred and ninety-one, and the total amount expended for their benefit \$2,394.58. The introduction of various literary and social features, and the opening of a correspondence throughout this and the adjoining States and Territories, it is confidently expected will largely add to the usefulness of the institution, which has already attracted the marked admiration of the people of San Francisco. The Board of Relief is in attendance daily from 10 A. M., to 1 P. M.
