

U. S. Branch Mint.

North Side of Commercial near Montgomery.

The law for the establishment and regulation of the United States Mint, and the branches thereof, provides that any person may deposit with the officers in charge of the same, gold and silver in bullion, grain, or lumps, which, if requested, shall be refined, assayed, and cast into bars or coined, as speedily as possible after the receipt thereof. The bars to be stamped in said mint or branches in such manner as shall indicate the weight, value, and fineness of the same. The expense incurred to be retained from each deposit so made, at such rates and charges, and under such regulations, as may from time to time be established. The said charges not to exceed the actual cost of refining, casting, and forming said bars, including labor, wastage, use of machinery, material, etc., or one-half per cent. for coinage, to be received by the Treasurer of the Mint at which the deposit was made, and by him accounted for to the Treasurer of the United States.
