TWELFTH WARD—First Precinct.—Bounded by the waters of the Bay on the north, Larkin street on the east, Washington street and a direct line to the Pacific Ocean on the south, and the Pacific Ocean on the west.

Second Precinct.—Bounded by Washington street and a direct line to the Pacific Ocean on the north, Larkin on the east, Post and a direct line to the Pacific Ocean on the south, and the Pacific Ocean on the west.

Third Precinct.—Bounded by Post street and a direct line to the Pacific ocean on the north, Larkin on the east, Eddy as produced, and a direct line to the Pacific Ocean on the south, and the Pacific Ocean on the west.

Fourth Precinct.—Bounded by Eddy street as produced, and a direct line to the Pacific Ocean on the north, Larkin on the east, Grove street and a direct line to the Pacific Ocean on the south, and the Pacific Ocean on the west.

Fifth Precinct.—Bounded by Grove street and a direct line to the Pacific Ocean on the north, Larkin on the east, Market from Larkin to Ridley on the southeast, Ridley and a direct line to the Pacific Ocean on the south, and the Pacific ocean on the west.

**City Ordinance No. 285—Hacks and Cabs
—Rates of Fare.**

A hack for one person not exceeding one mile.....	\$1 50
A hack for two or more persons not exceeding one mile.....	2 50
Each additional mile for each passenger.....	50
A cab for one person not exceeding one mile.....	1 00
A cab for two or more persons not exceeding one mile.....	1 50
Each passenger for each additional mile.....	25
A cab for two persons, when engaged by the hour, to be computed for the time occupied in going and returning, including detention, for the first hour.....	1 50
Each subsequent hour so used.....	1 00
A hack for four or less persons, when engaged by the hour; to be computed for the time occupied in going and returning, including detention, for the first hour.....	3 00
Each subsequent hour so used.....	2 00
No extra charge to any passenger shall be made for the ordinary amount of baggage	

SEC. 5 OF ORDER 43.—From the landing of any steamboat to any point east of the west line of Mason street, and north of the south line of Brannan street, east of Third street, shall in all cases be estimated not to exceed one mile

Penalty not less than \$5 or more than \$10, each offense.
