Election Districts.

STATE CONGRESSIONAL.

First District.—The City and County of San Francisco.
Second District.—The counties of Contra Costa, Alameda, San Joaquin, Calaveras, Amador, El Dorado, Sacramento, Placer, Nevada, Alpine, and Tuolumne.
Third District.—The counties of Marin, Sonoma, Napa, Lake, Solano, Yolo, Sutter, Yuba, Sierra, Butte, Plumas, Lassen, Tehama, Colusa, Mendocino, Humboldt, Trinity, Shasta, Modoc, Siskiyou, Klamath, and Del Norte.
Fourth District.—San Diego, Los Angeles, San Benito, San Bernardino, Santa Barbara, Ventura, San Luis Obispo, Tulare, Monterey, Fresno, Kern, Merced, Mariposa, Stanislaus, Santa Clara, Santa Cruz, San Mateo, Mono, and Inyo.

At the election September, 1878, and at the election every two years thereafter, there shall be elected from each district one Representative to the Congress of the United States.

JUDICIAL.

Third District.—Comprises the Fifth Ward of the City of San Francisco and the County of Alameda.
Fourth District.—Comprises the Second, Fourth, and Twelfth wards of the City of San Francisco.
Twelfth District.—Comprises the Seventh, Ninth, Tenth, and Eleventh wards of the City of San Francisco.
Fifteenth District.—Comprises the First and Third wards of the City of San Francisco and the County of Contra Costa.
Nineteenth District.—Comprises the Sixth and Eighth wards of the City of San Francisco.

SENATORIAL AND ASSEMBLY.

Eighth District.—The City and County of San Francisco and the County of San Mateo shall be the Eighth Senatorial District, and shall elect one Senator; the County of San Mateo shall elect one member of the Assembly.

Ninth District.—Commencing at a point where southerly line of United States Military Reservation known as the "Presidio Reservation," intersects with waters of the Pacific Ocean; thence meandering along waters of said ocean and the waters of the Bay of San Francisco, northerly, easterly, and southerly, to the point where Washington Street intersects with said Bay; thence westerly along said Washington Street, to its intersection with First Avenue; thence northerly, along said avenue to its intersection with the southerly boundary line to "Presidio Reservation;" thence westerly and along southerly boundary line of the said "Presidio Reservation," to its intersection with the Pacific Ocean, and point of beginning, shall be the Ninth Senatorial District and shall elect two senators and four members of the Assembly.

Tenth District.—Commencing at a point where southerly boundary line of the "Presidio Reservation" intersects with the waters of the Pacific Ocean; thence easterly and along the southerly boundary line of "Presidio Reservation" to the point where First Avenue intersects with said boundary line; thence south along said First Avenue to the point where Washington Street intersects with said First Avenue; thence east along said Washington Street to its intersection with waters of the Bay of San Francisco; thence south along the line of said bay to the point of intersection with Market Street with said bay; thence westerly along Market Street to the point where Geary Street intersects with said Market Street; thence westerly along Geary Street to where it connects with the Point Lobos Toll Road; thence along said Point Lobos Toll Road, said toll road produced in a direct line to the Pacific Ocean; thence northerly along said ocean to the point of beginning, shall be the Tenth Senatorial District, shall elect two Senators and four members of the Assembly.

Eleventh District.—Commencing at a point on the Market Street where Fourth Street intersects with Market Street; thence easterly and along said Market
