ALAMEDA COUNTY.

Is situated on the east shore of San Francisco Bay, opposite and about six miles distant from San Francisco. The city receives its name from groves of evergreen oaks, which covered the ground which it now occupies. It is a beautiful and rapidly growing city, its population having increased about 19,000 in the past five years, it now numbering 30,000. It is the center of the railroad system of the Pacific coast. Its educational facilities are unlimited. The University of California is located at Berkeley, a village it may be said in the suburbs of Oakland. Several private schools and seminaries of excellence are located here, and the public schools are of a high order. The State asylum for the education of the deaf, mute and blind is particularly interesting to visitors.
