AMERICAN TRACT SOCIETY—PACIFIC AGENCY.—Rev. Frederick E. Shearer, Secretary. This society was organized in 1825, to diffuse Gospel truth through the printed page. Its headquarters are at 150 Nassau Street, New York. The Pacific agency was established in December, 1890, and employed last year twenty-two colporters, three of whom were converted Chinamen. Its missionary work in this field, with the aid rendered to churches and Sunday Schools, was at a cost of \$10,000.

Its depository at 757 Market Street is also the depository of the California Bible Society, the American Sunday School Union, the Presbyterian Board of Publication, and the Congregational Publishing Society.

CALIFORNIA BIBLE SOCIETY.—Organized October 30, 1849, with John M. Finley as President, and the Revs. J. L. Ver Mehr, Albert Williams, and W. Taylor, Vice-Presidents, and T. D. Hunt as Secretary. The first building of the society, on Stockton Street, was destroyed by fire April 26, 1853, when a new one was erected on the same site, at an expense of \$7,000. The corner stone of the building, on Market Street was laid with appropriate ceremonies May 2, 1862. Having disposed of the property owned by the society on Stockton Street, they selected the present location on a growing thoroughfare, in hopes that the future income of the property will enable them to more fully extend the circulation of the Holy Scriptures in this State and the Pacific Coast. The building is fifty by seventy-five feet, three stories high, with stores on the ground floor. One of them is now occupied as the depository of the society. The name of the society was changed by Act of the Legislature, 1859, from the San Francisco Bible Society to its present title. New constitution adopted November, 1860. Depository, 757 Market Street. Meetings of the Board of Trustees are held by appointment on the Tuesday after the first Sunday of each month.
