This church was organized March 6, 1870, in Pacific Hall, by the Presbytery of San Francisco, with fifty-eight communicating members. The number at present is three hundred.

Church services at eleven o'clock A. M. and half past seven o'clock P. M.

The Sabbath School connected with the church has five hundred members, and a library containing thirteen hundred and seventeen volumes, with numerous diagrams of Bible places and scenes. It meets at half-past nine o'clock A. M.

**Olivet Presbyterian Church.**

Location, Tennessee street, between Sierra and Napa. Rev. J. T. Willis, Pastor, residence, Railroad avenue, between Eleventh and Twelfth avenues, South S. P.

This Church was erected in 1870. The church affords sittings for two hundred and fifty. Services every Sabbath at half-past eleven o'clock, A. M.

Sabbath School at 1 o'clock, P. M. Connected with the school is a library of five hundred volumes.

**Memorial Presbyterian Church.**

Location, Eighteenth avenue, near Railroad avenue, South San Francisco. Rev. J. T. Willis, Pastor, residence, Railroad avenue, between Eleventh and Twelfth avenues.

This Church was organized March 23, 1871. Services every Sabbath at half-past ten o'clock, A. M.

The Sabbath School connected with the church meets at two o'clock P. M., and numbers seventy-five members.

**Hamilton Square Presbyterian Church.**

Services held in Hamilton Hall, corner Geary and Steiner streets.

This church was organized January 23, 1880. Services every Sabbath at eleven o'clock A. M. and half past seven o'clock P. M.

**Nee Valley and Bernal Heights Mission.**

Corner Twenty-third and Sanchez streets. Rev. John Carrington, Pastor, residence, 369 Chattanooga.

**Woodbridge Presbyterian Church.**

Location, corner of Twentieth and Capp streets. Rev. Joseph Hemphill, Pastor, residence, 3645 Howard street.

This church was organized Easter Sunday, 1874. Services at eleven o'clock A. M. and half-past seven o'clock P. M. The Sunday School has an average attendance of three hundred, and meets at half past twelve o'clock P. M.

**Welsh Presbyterian Church.**

Place of worship, Cambrian Hall, 1133 Mission street. Rev. Moses Williams, Pastor, residence, 613 Mission street. Organized March 17, 1874. Number of members one hundred and ten. Hours of service, eleven o'clock A. M. and half-past seven o'clock P. M. Sunday School at half past two o'clock P. M. Average attendance, fifty.

**First Presbyterian Chinese Church.**

Location, west side of Stockton street, between Washington and Clay. Rev. A. W. Loomis, D. D., residence, 1935 Jones street, and Rev. A. J. Kerr, A. M., residence, 1238 Hyde street, Missionaries, with two native assistants.

This house was formerly the First Presbyterian Church. It was purchased in 1882 by the Presbyterian Board of Foreign Missions. It has about six hundred sittings.

Religious services in the Chinese and English languages are held every Sabbath morning and evening; Sabbath Schools after the morning service and at six P. M.

**Chinese Mission House.**

Location, northeast corner of Stockton and Sacramento streets. Rev. A. W. Loomis, D. D., residence, 1935 Jones street, and Rev. A. J. Kerr, A. M., residence, 1238 Hyde street, Missionaries.

The house is brick and was built by the liberality of the citizens of San Francisco and by funds from the Presbyterian Board of Foreign Missions, whose agents are New York and by which this mission to

contains school rooms and rooms for a Chinese Christian Association, a chapel which will seat nearly hundred people, and apartments for the resident mission family.

An evening school is open throughout the year. It is free to the Chinese, and is taught by the students and other teachers who are supporters of the Mission.

Religious services in the Chinese and English languages are held at the close of each evening and special services on Wednesday and Sabbath evenings.

**St. Mary's Cathedral.**

Location, northeast corner of California and Dr. streets. Most Rev. Joseph S. Alemany Archbishop, Most Rev. P. W. Elviran, Coadjutor, Very Rev. Prendergast, V. G. Pastor; Rev. J. G. O'Connell and M. D. Connelly, Assistants; Rev. Geo. Montague, Secretary, archdiocesan and pastoral residence, California street.

The erection of this structure was commenced in 1853, and dedicated December 25, 1854.

Masses, Sundays, at half past seven, nine, and past ten o'clock A. M.; week days, six, half-past seven, and half-past seven o'clock A. M.; Vespers, half-past seven o'clock Sunday evenings.

**St. Dominic's Church and Monastery.**

Location, northwest corner of Bush and S. streets. A large church in course of erection, completed probably next year. Served by the Dominican Fathers connected with the Church.

Attached to the Church are Confraternities—Most Holy Rosary, Holy Name of Jesus and A. Warfare, also, a benevolent society.

Masses Sunday at six, seven, half-past eight past nine and half past ten o'clock A. M. Solemn benediction at half-past seven o'clock P. M. Week days at six, half-past six, seven and o'clock A. M.

**St. Francis' Church.**

Location, north side of Vallejo street, between post and Stockton. Rev. J. F. Harrington, Pastor, residence, Rev. P. B. Duffy, Assistants, pastoral residence, northeast corner Vallejo street, Montgomery avenue.

This church was organized by Very Rev. A. Langlois, in the Spring of 1849.

Masses: Sundays at a quarter past six, half seven, nine, and half past ten o'clock A. M. School at half past one o'clock P. M. Vespers benediction on Sundays at half past seven o'clock P. M. Mass on week days at seven o'clock A. M. Sunday School at nine o'clock A. M.

**St. Ignatius' Church.**

Location, north side of Hayes street, west of New avenue. Served by the Fathers of the Society of Jesus, connected with St. Ignatius' College.

Masses: Sundays, at five, forty-five minutes, five, half past six, fifteen minutes past seven, forty-five minutes past eight, half past nine, and past ten o'clock A. M.; Vespers at half past o'clock P. M. Masses on week days at five, five minutes past five, half past six, fifteen minutes past seven, and eight o'clock A. M.

**St. Patrick's Church.**

Location, north side of Mission street, between Third and Fourth. Rev. Peter J. Grey, Pastor, Thomas Larkin and Rev. H. P. Gallagher, Assistants, pastoral residence, 744 Mission street.

Masses: Sundays, at fifteen minutes past six, minutes past seven, eight, nine, and half-past o'clock A. M.; during the week, daily, at half-past seven o'clock A. M.; Vespers and benediction of the M. H. S., at half-past seven o'clock P. M. A boys' school is held in the basement.

**Notre Dame des Victoires.**

Location, north side of Bush street, between post and Stockton. Rev. Pierre Robert, Pastor; residence, 326 Bush street.
