Multnomah County—The city is situated on the Willamette River, twelve miles above its confluence with the Columbia. Portland's growth and progress are based upon the solid foundation of natural advantages of position. It lies in the very heart of a great producing country which has no other outlet, and for which it must serve as a receiver and distributor of exports and imports. It is the most westerly terminus of three overland railroads. Elegant passenger steamships sail to San Francisco and Puget Sound, Columbia and Alaska. The press of Portland is well represented, which in their columns news can be found from all parts of the world, which comprises four dailies and fourteen weeklies, besides several other commercial publications. Portland, a metropolitan city, can boast of her fine churches, schools, public buildings, parks and business blocks, and well laid out streets, which are kept clean the year round.
