This is an organization of honorably discharged soldiers, sailors and marines of the Army and Navy of the United States, who served to suppress the late rebellion, and whose objects are to perpetuate a fraternal feeling among its members, to aid and assist those in distress, and provide for the widows and orphans of their deceased comrades. The place for holding the annual meeting of the Department of California is designated from year to year. The next annual encampment (April, 1891) will be held in Santa Cruz.
