There are one hundred and fifty Courts in the State, also branches known as Knights of Sherwood Forest, and the Companions of the Forest.

The Supreme body of the order is known as the Supreme Court, and was organized in Minneapolis on August 15, 1889, having on that day acceded from the Ancient Order of Foresters in England. The Supreme Court meets biennially. Next meeting at Detroit, Michigan.
