DEPARTMENT OF CALIFORNIA AND NEVADA. Organized April 15, 1867. Headquarters, City Hall, third floor. Objects—To organize, and to promote and perpetuate a fraternal feeling amongst all honorably discharged soldiers, marines and sailors who served in the war of the Rebellion; also to aid those of them who are in distress, and to provide for widows and orphans of deceased comrades.
