**St. Luke's Hospital.** Established in 1861. Valencia street, near junction of Mission street.

**St. Mary's Hospital.** 2344 Sutter street. Conducted by the Sisters of Mercy.

**St. Peter's Academy.** 1245 Alabama street. This house of protection and refuge for young women of good reputation is under the charge of the Sisters of Mercy.

**St. Thomas Hospital.** 300 Page street.

**St. Winifred's Sanatorium.** 1065 Sutter street. Dr. Winslow Anderson, Chief Surgeon.

**Twenty-sixth Street Hospital.** (See City and County Government.)

**University Mound Old Ladies' Home.** University street, between Felton and Bayland, University Mound Tract. H. Stetzel, President; E. W. Newhall, Secretary.

**Veterans' Home of California.** A State home for disabled volunteer soldiers and sailors, under the control of board of directors, appointed by the Governor of the State.

Every worthy officer, soldier, sailor, marine, who is a bona fide resident of the State and who honorably served in the Army or Navy of the United States in any war in which the country has been engaged, and who is in indigent circumstances, and by reason of age, infirmity, or wounds received in service, incapable of self-support, shall be entitled to admission into the Home, subject to the laws of the State of California
