

settled soon after. Between Fort Point in the Presidio and Lime Point on the Marin shore is the narrowest part of the Golden Gate, one mile. At Fort Point is Fort Winfield Scott, an old brick defense begun in 1854, replacing the Spanish Fort Blanco. On Lime Point across the strait is Fort Baker; above it on the hill, 493 feet above the water, is Battery Spencer. This is the highest land battery in the world.

TRANSPORTATION

San Francisco is particularly fortunate in its transportation facilities. It is the terminus of five trunk-line railroads: The Southern Pacific, Union Pacific, Western Pacific, Northwestern Pacific and the Santa Fe. From the metropolis extends a network of interurban electric railways into adjoining cities and suburbs. In addition to the steam and electric lines there are motor bus stages from the city to various points extending as far as Los Angeles in the South and to various points in the eastern and northern part of the State.
