Includes valuable Sutro Library of about 70,000 rare books, manuscripts, etc., presented to the California State Library by the heirs of the late Adolph Sutro, Esq., in 1913, and about 12,000 other items added during 1917 by deposit and gift, such as sample copies of books by California publishers, the libraries of the California Genealogical Society and the Astronomical Society of the Pacific, the library of the late Mrs. Walter Damon Mansfield and a part of the library of the California Society Sons of the American Revolution.
