1906 San Francisco Earthquake Marriage Phenomena

San Francisco, CA (19 December 2005)—On 18 April 1906, San Francisco experienced a major earthquake and the resulting fires nearly destroyed the entire city. Over the next month, among the news reports of the disaster and death, a strange phenomena was being reported: couples were getting married in record numbers. To explore this phenomena, Ron Filion and Pamela Storm Wolfskill, the creators of SFgenealogy.com, have developed the "1906 San Francisco Earthquake Project."

The project collects, explores and presents the numerous stories and news reports that document the phenomena. These have been collected from various locations including Los Angeles, Oakland, Sacramento, Portland, Seattle, and San Francisco.

In addition to researching San Francisco couples that were married within the first month of the disaster, it also explores those couples who met afterwards because of it. Some of the descendants of both of these groups have been found and their family histories have been presented, showing the impact their family has had on the culture, politics and history of San Francisco and California.
