Share a party line?

These easy pointers can help you and your party line neighbor enjoy even better telephone service: When you have a series of calls to make, allow a few minutes between them • Replace the receiver properly after calling • If you have a dial telephone, make sure the line is not in use before you dial • Ask the children to be considerate, too. You'll not only be a good telephone neighbor if you do . . . but others will have a better chance to reach you!

The blue-print stage is the time to include built-in telephone conduit and outlets. During construction, the cost is trifling. Just a few pieces of pipe or other conduit material leading to convenient outlet locations will provide raceways for telephone wires. Later on telephones can be added — or moved to other locations — without drilling holes or running wire along baseboards.
