THE HIGH SENIORS






THE LOW SENIORS





This year's rifle team is composed of the fifteen best shots in the battalion; ably coached by their battalion instructor, Sgt. Frederick W. Babel. George Wash-




Last came the battle royal with the Van Ness Varsity. Cleating up the field from one end to the other, neither team could find that extra touchdown, and the game ended 13-13.





Tuesdays find Miss Forcade in the gym with the advanced badminton, and Misses Poole and Shearer at the San Francisco Riding Academy with beginning classes.


On Wednesday Miss Forcade supervises tennis and Miss Poole is at Winterland with the ice skaters.
